## **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES**

Dr. Charles (Chuck) Campbell joined our team of professional instructors 2013. He has many years of experience in program and project management as a practitioner, trainer, and educator. Dr. Campbell helped clients develop and execute strategies to establish, improve, and sustain the effective and efficient management of programs and projects. His clients included U.S. Department of Defense systems acquisition program managers, as well as numerous organizations in business and industry.

Chuck has over thirty years of experience in organizational program and project management, including training and education. He holds the Project Management Professional (PMP<sup>®</sup>) and Professional in Business Analysis (PMI-PBA<sup>®</sup>) credentials from the Project Management Institute and the Project+ credential from CompTIA. Chuck is also a corporate-certified Lean Six Sigma Green Belt (LSSGB)
